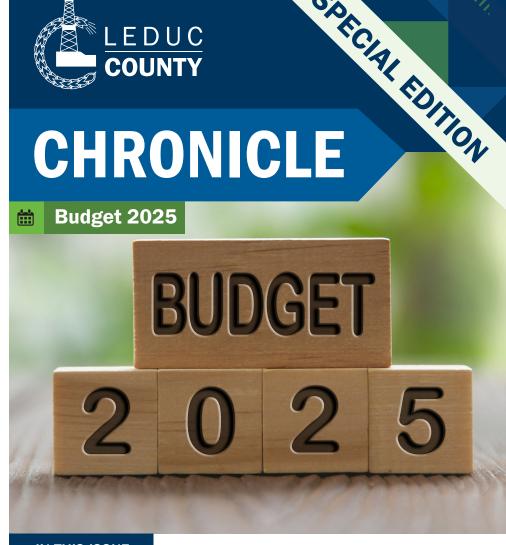

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2025 budget breakdown

Details on operating and capital budgets.

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YOUR 2025 BUDGET BREAKDOWN

Leduc County Council approved a **\$111,903,630** operating budget, which covers day-to-day municipal operating expenses. This operating budget also includes tax dollars that are collected on behalf of the Government of Alberta and the Leduc Regional Housing Foundation.

- Municipal services \$77,457,301
- Provincial education property tax requisition increase of 15.48 per cent — \$32,888,079
- Designated Industrial properties* increase of 16.54 per cent — \$152,357
- Leduc Regional Housing Foundation increase of 396 per cent — \$1,253,295
- *Designated Industrial properties tax levy is set by the Government of Alberta and applies to linear properties, such as pipelines, powerlines and sometimes their machinery and equipment.

Budget highlights

- More than \$18.5 million for road projects and maintenance
- **\$4.2 million** for public transit
- **\$3.7 million** for bridge projects
- \$2.25 million in cost-share recreation support to five partner municipalities
- \$422,000 for support to not-forprofit facilities and community recreation and cultural grants
- > \$283,290 to support libraries

The final 2025 budget outlines a **\$26,670,045** capital budget, which includes key infrastructure projects to cover costs for roads, bridges, buildings and equipment.

No change in 2025 municipal tax rates

YOUR 2025 TAX BREAKDOWN

Like 2023 and 2024, Leduc County experienced more growth within its boundary than forecasted. What does this mean?

Taxable assessment values grew from \$9.86 billion to \$10.7 billion, or 8.48 per cent, resulting in \$4,719,956 million in additional tax dollars for 2025.

Considering the additional tax dollars, no change to our tax rates (residential and non-residential) is required to meet our budget requirements for 2025. This allows us to continue providing the high-quality services our citizens and businesses expect.

Municipal property taxes

Municipal property taxes fund services such as:

- Agricultural services
- Family and Community Support Services (FCSS)
- Parks and Recreation services
- Planning and Development
- Protective Services (fire and enforcement)
- Revenue sharing with the City of Leduc for property taxes collected from Edmonton International Airport (YEG) properties
- Road maintenance
- Infrastructure maintenance and upgrades
- Provincial Police Funding model
- Transit

Total: \$59,179,098 (2024 was \$54.5 million)

Requisitions

Each year, Leduc County collects tax dollars on behalf of the **Government of Alberta** and the **Leduc Regional Housing Foundation**. These funds are called requisitions.

Leduc County has no control over this amount and is obligated to collect taxes on behalf of the these organizations. Once collected, the funds are forwarded to the Government of Alberta and housing foundation.

For 2025, Leduc County is collecting: Government of Alberta:

- Alberta School Foundation Fund \$32,888,079
- Designated Industrial properties \$152,357

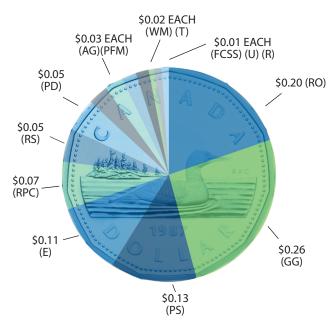

Your assessment reflects your property's market value as of July 1, 2024

Understanding your assessment

In Alberta, residential and most commercial properties are assessed at market value using mass appraisal. Your property assessment is a reflection of your property's market value as of July 1, 2024, and its physical condition as of Dec. 31, 2024.

A valuation date ensures all properties in a municipality are valued as of the same date. The valuation date is set by legislation from the *Municipal Government Act (MGA)*.

In any given year, property assessment values change based on a few factors:

- Market value changes
- Physical changes to a property, such as new construction, renovations and significant improvements
- Change in property use

TIPP option available to eligible property owners

Make paying your property taxes easier by setting up a pre-authorized tax instalment payment plan (TIPP).

We offer eligible property owners TIPP as a convenient way of paying property taxes in monthly instalments instead of one lump sum. There is no cost to enrol in the TIPP program. Monthly instalments are withdrawn automatically from a bank account, so there is no need to write a cheque, mail your payment or visit County Centre. Before enrolling, confirm with your mortgage provider that property tax payments aren't already being deducted from your account.

How does TIPP work?

Taxes are based on a calendar year. If you enrol mid-year, you must pay the taxes owing on a pro-rated basis for the current calendar year. For the first five months of the year, your monthly instalment is based on the amount of tax levy from the previous year. The instalment amount is then adjusted in June for the last seven months of the year based on your current tax levy amount. If an adjustment is made to your instalment amount, you will be notified. Bank withdrawals are on the first day of every month. The plan automatically continues year-

to-year until you submit a notification of cancellation to the County.

To qualify for enrolment:

- Any outstanding balances and taxes owing on a pro-rated basis for the current calendar year must be paid in full.
- You must have a chequing account at a Canadian bank.
- You must not be paying your property taxes through your mortgage provider.

To enrol for TIPP:

Visit **leduc-county.com/taxes** to apply online. A VOID cheque or pre-authorized debit (PAD) form is required and can be attached when completing the application.

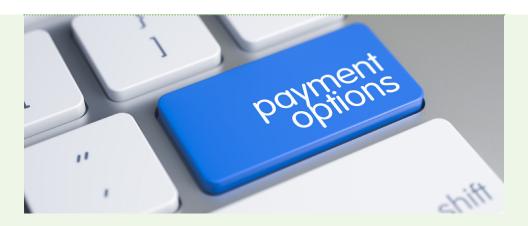

Tax payment options and deadlines

- Mailed payments must be postmarked by Canada Post before June 30, 2025.
- In-person payments must be made at the County Centre on or before June 30, 2025.
- Online payments must be made on or before June 25, 2025 (NOTE: online payments are not processed on weekends).
- Drop-off payments (cheque only; no cash) in the County Centre mailbox, north side of the building on or before June 30, 2025.
