

How to apply for an online burn permit

This process takes you through the steps needed to apply for an online burn permit. Please note before applying for a permit you must create a user account.

- 1. Visit Leduc County's burn permits website at https://lcfs.burnpermits.com/
- 2. Select "Create Account."



3. Select the appropriate permit type

Select Permit Type:

O Nisku Burning Permit
Choose this permit if you plan on burning within the Nisku
Business Park of Leduc County


O Rural Burning Permit (Smaller than 100 sq. ft.)
Choose this permit if you plan on burning within Leduc
County Rural and your burn pile is anticipated to be
smaller than 100 sq ft.

O Rural Burning Permit (Larger than 100 sq. ft.)
Choose this permit if you plan on burning within Leduc
County Rural and your burn pile is anticipated to be larger
than 100 sq ft.


- 4. Input the information requested, including contact information and set a password. Once complete, select **continue** at the bottom of the page.
- 5. Next, enter a description of what is being burned. Please be as detailed as possible. Example:

Partial straw bale in a cultivated field. OR Small brush pile 100 ft from any burnable material.







6. Add location where burning is taking place. Multiple locations can be added for one permit.













You also must indicate if you own the property or if it is rented. Burning is not allowed if the property is rented without approval from the landlord. If you choose rental, the following message will pop up in order for the landlord to be contacted to give approval.




7. A map of your property will pop up and the red marker will be bouncing. Select the red marker (close to the pointy end) to move it to the location of the burn on the property.



As seen in the example below, the red marker has been placed further into the property where the burning will take place. Click on the **add address** blue button when complete.







Additional addresses can be added at this point if needed. For example, this may be needed if a farmer is burning at several fields as they clean up broken bales in the fall. Once all addresses have been added, click on the blue **continue box** at the bottom of the page.








8. The next stage is where you will get to the "agree statements." The person applying for the permit will have to agree to each statement to be issued a permit. There is also a link to Leduc County's burning bylaw for your reference.




Please note in this example, all of the conditions are not noted. Select the blue **continue** button to go to the next step.



9. The next field gives an option for users to upload photos, which will show on the final permit and may assist fire staff or guardians in assessing the burn for approval. Select the blue **continue** button to move to the next page.



10. The next field indicates the length of the permit (two weeks) and gives the user a place to sign.






11. Below the signature you will choose how you would like to be notified should the County have future messages that need to be shared, such as "Leduc County is now under a fire restriction. Please put out all fires."


You will have the choice of email, phone number or text message. Click on the red box that says **non preferred** to change it to **preferred**. When entering your phone number, you must follow the specified format in order for it to be accepted. Select the blue **continue** box when completed.

Notification Methods



12. The permit has now been completed and will be available to you. If it is a larger burn that requires an inspection or approval, this will be indicated until the permit has been approved.





13. Remember, you must call to register your burn when you are ready. Please call 587-805-0262 to register your burn. It will be approved for 24 hours. If you do not register your burn, it will not be considered permitted.
