long-term viability, and will minimize the loss of agricultural land and conversion of agricultural land to agricultural uses. Leduc County's foundation is agriculture, and the MDP reflects that history and seeks to ensure that agriculture is a priority



focus for development decisions in the county. These KPIs are selected to provide a consistent measure of the rate at which agricultural land is being fragmented and/or converted to non-agricultural uses, as well as to track the growth of agribusiness in the county.




