



Leduc County adopted its new Municipal Development Plan (MDP) in 2019. The MDP provides high-level guidance and direction for development in the county based on the vision and goals that were expressed by the community during the creation of the plan. The MDP also includes direction to implement a program to track our progress and identify areas where the county is succeeding, and areas where we need to adjust our processes and policies.

This is the third report. What you see below represents a snapshot of Leduc County at the end of 2021, and does not include any comparisons.

Protect agricultural land and support diversity in agriculture

GOAL

Leduc County recognizes and champions the importance of agriculture, is committed to ensuring its long-term viability, and will minimize the loss of agricultural land and conversion of agricultural land

to agricultural uses. Leduc County's foundation is agriculture, and the MDP reflects that history and seeks to ensure that agriculture is a priority focus for development decisions in the county. These KPIs are selected to provide a consistent measure of the rate at which


