Public Presentation – Morgan Webb, Lab Manager Seed Check Technologies

003-2024 Mr. Webb presented on *Fusarium graminearum* testing results.

- Fusarium was considered a banned pest in Alberta at one time, but is now off the Agricultural Pest Act
- It is considered a fungal disease spread by spores, seed born
- It can be on plants or debris in the field
- Fusarium causes toxins which can lead to: problems making beer and bread, making animals sick and/or not gain weight, plants not being able to produce seeds, and poor germination
- For the optimal growth of *Fusarium*, it needs moisture and high temperature during flowering periods; dry and cool temperature means much less growth
- 8-10% of samples tested positive; of those 2-3% were highly infested making them unusable as feed
- Southern Alberta has historically had more, however with moisture and heat in July the highest numbers are within a 200 km radius of Edmonton this year
- Seeds can be tested with DNA (would not receive a percentage; detects positive even if spores are dead; have to follow with Plate Test if positive), or Plate Test (gives percentage; only living infection is counted)
- It is most commonly found on corn, barely, wheats, oats, and anything in the grass family; occasionally found on lentils

A)

- Fungus can be carried over a year or two later
- To help prevent *Fusarium* infection:
 - o rotate crops (especially from cereals)
 - o spray fungicide (when weather conditions are favourable)
 - o store cool and dry
 - o treat seeds
