Q2 2022 reporting, ending June 30, 2022

General Manager of Financial and Corporate Services Renee Klimosko provided an overview of the 2022 Q2 reporting, with directors of departments in attendance to answer questions related to their respective departments.

In response to questions, the following was provided:

- The quarterly reports get posted on the Leduc County website in 2 locations.
- Debt limit the next debenture will be completed within the next five years.
- Transit update currently have a consultant on board and should be conducting a series of open houses; hope to get it before council by the end of 2022.
- All cargo of commercial and non-commercial loads (including grain/cereal loads) must be tarped.
- There have been no concerns received with respect to the new Burning Bylaw.
- The discussions around fire services and the Village of Warburg are still under lawyer review.
- The fire restriction is still in effect.
- The library contributions are a one-time payment at the start of each year.
- Continue to liase with Capital Regional Wastewater Services Commission (CRWSC) for improvement of lines.
- The Kavanagh landfill will be included in the 2023 budget.
