MINUTES OF LEDUC COUNTY, AGRICULTURAL SERVICE BOARD MEETING HELD ON JANUARY 21, 2019 IN THE COUNCIL CHAMBERS OF THE COUNTY CENTRE, NISKU, ALBERTA

Order and Roll Call

The Agricultural Service Board meeting was called to order at 9:00 a.m., Monday, January 21, 2019 by Chair Glenn Belozer with Board Members Kelly-Lynn Lewis, Ray Scobie, Kelly Vandenberghe, Larry Wanchuk and Public Members-At-Large Roy Eckert and Russell Kushinski present. Board Member Tanni Doblanko arrived after the call to order. Board Member Rick Smith was unable to attend for personal reasons.

Board Member Doblanko and Mr. Thomas

Board Member Doblanko and Mr. Thomas, Deputy County Manager/General Manager, Community & Protective Services entered the Council Chambers at 9:02 a.m.

Presentation

Mr. Broadbent, Director of Agricultural Services introduced Mr. Jason Sanders, Physical Hydrogeology Discipline Lead, Millennium EMS Solutions Ltd. and provided information that Mr. Sanders has been working on the water point project in coordination with Capital Power.

Groundwater in Alberta presentation:

- Groundwater is a renewable resource of great importance in Alberta
- 21% of Albertans rely on groundwater as their water supply
- Estimated that there is approximately 40,000 km³ of groundwater in Alberta; only 0.01% is believed to be recoverable due to its depth below ground surface
- Groundwater falls into two categories: Non-saline <4,000 mg/l TDS (shallow) and saline >4,000 mg/l TDS (typically at depths greater than 600 meters in Leduc County area)
- Groundwater recharge: Water that enters the subsurface and becomes part of the groundwater system; typically about 5% of annual precipitation enters aquifers as recharge. In Alberta recharge is a spring time event occurring just after frost leaves the ground and is local in effect.
- Groundwater discharge occurs in areas where there is an overall upward movement of groundwater. Typically springs or marshes.
- Aquifers: A body of rock or sediment that is sufficiently permeable to conduct groundwater. Sufficiency is expressed in terms of end use i.e. domestic vs industrial igpm yield
- There are no "underground rivers" in Alberta. Water is present in sand, gravel, or fractures in bedrock.
- Aquifers in surficial deposits is constrained to locations of sand and gravel, is typically hard water with high concentrations of iron, manganese and calcium.
 Bedrock aquifers are typically soft water with higher concentrations of sodium.
- Water wells require regular, on-going maintenance. Wellhead protection, servicing pump and pressure system, shock chlorination. 95% of water quantity or quality changes are due to issues with the water well itself.
- Licensing is required for all non-domestic/agricultural use of non-saline water. Domestic and traditional ag use has priority over industrial use. In Alberta: First in time, first in line.

- Review of Leduc County/Capital Power waterpoint project: 17.4 igpm long term yield fresh water well. Development for non-potable agricultural use.
- Decommissioning old water wells: An abandoned water well can be an open conduit for contamination, hence the importance of proper procedures for decommissioning. Grant funding is available for decommissioning.

Discussion took place about the Alberta Orphan Well program: Assessments, remediation/reclamation.

Mr. Broadbent, Director of Agricultural Services reported that Warburg Seed Cleaning Plant is investigating funding opportunities for proposed upgrades.

<u>2019 Provincial ASB Conference – Resolutions</u>

Mr. Van Beers, Agricultural Foreman provided a review of the six resolutions for review at the upcoming 2019 Provincial Agricultural Service Board Conference and invited Board Member discussion:

- Loss of 2% liquid strychnine Support
- Wildlife Predator Compensation Program Enhancement Enhancements to reporting for a more timely confirmation – Support
- Deadstock Removal Provincial government compensation to producers @ 50%
 Support
- Carbon Credits for Permanent Pasture and Forested Lands Include permanent pasture and land left forested under carbon credit program. Board discussion about practicality and realistic details of accessing the program – There will be opportunity to learn more through discussion at the Conference
- Multi-Stakeholder Committee to Work at Reducing the Use of Fresh Water by the Oil and Gas Industry in Alberta – Support



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 STEP Program Agricultural Eligibility – Currently limited to registered businesses, doesn't include family farm enterprises – Support

Mr. Van Beers alerted the Board Members that there might be an emergent resolution relating to the development of an ag producer mental health hotline and that there will be an opportunity for review with the sponsoring municipality prior to the Resolution Sessions at the Conference.

<u>Clubroot – Verbal Status Report</u>

Mr. Van Beers, Agricultural Foreman provided a verbal status report regarding his January 7, 2019 presentation at the Rockyview clubroot information meeting. The session was attended by 200 participants and Mr. Van Beers spoke on a municipality's role in supporting producers and enforcement of the Agricultural Pests Act. Additionally, Mr. Van Beers reviewed the January 18, 2019 clubroot information session that he hosted at the Nisku Recreation Centre for local producers and industry representatives, where a number of topics were covered:

- 2018 crop survey results,
- Dr. Strelkov, Mr. Dan Orchard, and a seed company representative spoke on varieties/resistance coming up
- Message from all industry representatives was to urge rotation
- Policy discussion, including engagement over specifying tillage vs crop that typically requires intensive tillage, such as potatoes
- Communicated invitation for upcoming focus group meetings

Discussion took place about updating the current clubroot policy to specify limiting tillage practices on lands under notice and the value of education.

SE 31-49-22-W4 - Drainage Concern Verbal Report

Mr. Broadbent, Director of Agricultural Services provided background information regarding a complaint from a property owner located west of the New Sarepta sewage lagoons with concerns about ongoing flooding on his property. This concern is long-standing and has been responded to by the Village of New Sarepta, Alberta Environment, Leduc County Utilities, and Agricultural Services in the past. The complainant's property is located in an area that is relatively flat and is subject to slow drainage during spring runoff and seasonal rainfall events.
