#### **Fire-Emergency Services**

#### **East District Fire Station Update**

Fire Chief Lefebvre reported that the Project team (himself, Deputy Chief Bennett and Project Manager Colin Roggeveen) met with Scott Builders on June 8, 2020. Scott Builders has been advised that Leduc County Council has provided approval to begin negotiations with them. As part of the negotiations, Scott Builders was advised that feasible cost savings need to be identified from the list of items that they provided at the interview stage. Some of those items include the following:

- > reduce the size of the office space while maintaining functionality for today and potential future needs over the life of the building:
- removing the cost associated with the installation of a exhaust capture system (plymovent);
- > along with many other small items that were considered to have minimal impact to the function of the building.

Fire Chief Lefebvre also reported that with the potential reduction in space on the second floor, Scott Builders is going to evaluate the option to go back to a single story office space and determine if this would also add to the cost savings in the overall project. Scott Builders was tasked with taking the recommended cost savings and determining if they can reduce the overall project cost to meet our target of \$3.6 million. The difference between the \$3.6 million and the total approved budget of \$3.97million are the costs associated with project management, utility connections, permitting, geotechnical, and contingency costs.

A follow-up meeting with Scott Builders will be scheduled for the week of June 22<sup>nd</sup>.

#### New 100-foot Aerial Ladder Apparatus (Tower 11) Update

Fire Chief Lefebvre reported that the new 100' Aerial Ladder (Tower 11) was delivered and will remain stationed in the Nisku District Station. The final fit out of the equipment mounts and locations on the new apparatus are currently underway at the fire services fleet shop. It is anticipated that the majority of these required fit ups will be completed by June 12<sup>th</sup>.

Starting June 12<sup>th</sup>, the manufacturers approved trainer will be on-site to provide three days of onsite training to the mechanics and operators. This training is part of the contract agreement. Training will be rolled out to the apparatus operators beginning June 15<sup>th</sup> with a required completion date of September 1<sup>st</sup>.

The old 1999 75-foot Aerial unit will be advertised for sale in the next couple of weeks.

#### **Standard of Cover - Station Location Master Plan Update**

Fire Chief Lefebvre reported that Standard of Cover - Station Location Master Plan Update final project deliverable is expected to be received by Q4 2020 from Darkhorse Analytics. The project centers around historical data which will show trends ensuring Leduc County Fire Services is properly prepared for future growth within Leduc County. A Station Location Master Plan and a program which immediately shows generally where to local future fire stations in line with growth targets, and the impact of adding or subtracting firefighters and crews into a geographical area is also part of this project which Leduc County Fire Services will have at its disposal, again, used for Fire Service forecasting in line with growth.

#### **Warburg Fire District Update**

Fire Chief Lefebvre reported that the Warburg Fire District has been under the direction of a temporary Warburg Fire Chief / Leduc County District Fire Chief since of the retirement of the previous fire chief in December 2019. Warburg Village Council has made a decision to extend the temporary contract with the current fire chief until September 2020. After meeting with Warburg administration, Leduc Fire Services has also agreed to extend the temporary contract with the fire chief until September in order to further research the future of fire services in Warburg and the Warburg Fire District. Outcomes of the research will be presented to committee members and Council for direction before the September expiry as soon as information is available.

# Sub-Regional Emergency Management Agency RFP Update

- > RFP was posted on April 30, 2020 and closed on May 29, 2020.
- ➤ Review committee consisted of representatives from Leduc County, City of Leduc and Town of Thorsby. Offer to participate also went out to Town of Calmar, City of Beaumont and Village of Warburg.
- > The committee reviewed five submissions and completed interviews of the short-listed candidates on June 10, 2020. The project will be awarded to Behr Integrated Solutions.
- Phase 1 of the work is dedicated to: research and information gathering; it requires the political and philosophical understanding of each participating municipality and the understanding of current emergency preparedness; completion August 30, 2020.
- > Phase 2 will consist of development of draft agreements, bylaws and emergency response plan; completion October 30, 2020.
