# Speed Reduction, Alberta Transportation Request - Airport Road East of Highway 814

#### **Road Maintenance and Transfer Station Presentation**

Mr. Farrell presented the following comments:

Rolly View transfer station:

- Has used this transfer station for 10 years
- Needs to be in utilities budget to maintain and re-gravel this road/area
- There has been piles of asphalt here for a year, needs to be put onto the road
- Bulk water station road is also bad
- The 3 year gravel program does not cover who is responsible for graveling to county facilities; there should be assigned responsibility to maintaining the roads to access Leduc County facilities
- The transfer stations have no power, this is a safety issue for the employees



#### Potholes:

- There should be documentation indicating how many potholes are repaired each year
- There needs to be a better understanding of policy for pothole repairs
- Pothole crews only put down 5 gallons to fix and then don't come back for weeks
- Previous council indicated that potholes were only fixed when there was a complaint made; should be proactively repaired rather than wait for a complaint
- Need road recovery plan
- Potholes need to be repaired quicker

#### Public Concern Database:

- Who utilizes this data? Is every concern taken care of?
- Database should be used to record all data, and someone should be responsible to oversee that every concern is followed up on

#### Airport Road:

 Airport Road exiting onto Range Roads, there is too big of a drop off on these turns, dangerous

# Shoulder Pulling:

- Appreciates the data
- If all the roads were to be done, would take 178 years to complete. Critical to have a long term plan

#### Annexation:

Pulled \$1m to fight annexation, so there must be money to fix roads
