#### Genesee Resident Concerns Re: 034-18, 017-18

Chair Smith invited members of the public who wanted to speak on this matter to come forward.

Ms. Linda Maki presented the following comments:

- Lives at 51055 Range Road 33.
- RUA states that dust suppression must be used in front of residences and businesses, do businesses apply to farms?
- The effect gravel mining operations had on residents, land, livestock, wildlife, trees and vegetation; dust is everywhere. Not just dust from the trucks travelling but as well from the mining activities.

- Noise
- Poor roads
- Land can become unusable
- Farmers livelihood ruined.
- Routes limited, can only use one road.
- One of the ways to mitigate is to pave the haul roads all roads in the Genesee area.
- This may help to limit the decrease in value of their property.

#### Mr. Lloyd Rosenke presented the following comments:

- Lives at 51060 Range Road 33
- Devastation to the pricing on their land in the area, their land is worth nothing.
- Unable to sell.
- Not just the gravel pits but also Capital Power.
- Their voices are not being heard as there are not too many residents out there.
- Tired of being called complainers.
- Unable to leave farm because it is raining because it makes the roads impassable.
- Maybe relocate the residents if you are going to allow the gravel companies to stay out there.
- This has gone on too long.
- Burnco not supposed to drive on the wet roads, advising that no one is enforcing the RUA. When they called in about this, nothing was done
- Different conditions for the different Road Use Agreements One that cannot work 24/7, one that can, one that has to have their crushed gravel covered and one that does not have to have it covered.
- Hours of hauling has to take place between 7 a.m. to 7 p.m. trucks going down to the pit at 5 a.m. to load.
- Strictly an enforcement problem. Believes that if we shut them down for one week it would solve the problem.
- Every road needs to be paved, dust or a mud hole out there all spring and summer long.
- They intend to pursue compensation from either the County or Gravel companies to pay for the devaluation of their properties, may let a 3<sup>rd</sup> party determine this.

#### Mr. Lee Pickerel presented the following comments:

- Property at SW 11 51 3 W5
- Landowner is only there on weekends.
- Dust and the dirt.
- When does the water truck come? after the first load?
- 5 a.m. empty truck coming past, extremely noisy.
- Blind corner 40 km/hr. two loaded trucks there would still be a problem.
- Need a change on all of the Y intersections, noticeable right of way?
- No quality of life
- Would like to have long weekends listed on RUA.

# Mr. Larry Akins presented the following comments:

- 3055 Township Road 511
- Cattle rancher in the area.
- Believes it is affecting his cattle in a negative way.
- Believes only pavement will solve their issues.

 Safety concerns on the width of the roads especially we the quantity of vehicles on the roads

Mr. Richard Skermer presented the following comments:

- 3161 Township Road 511
- Drone footage he has hours of it.
- Home is on the worse apex of the roads, where he was almost taken out a couple of times by gravel trucks.
- Corporate Social Responsibility leaving the area better than when you arrived.
- His mom very vocal in the past.
- Right-of-Way agreement from the Power Company worst place to have it (between to hills) and has almost come upon a semi.
- Tired of having their intelligence insulted.
- Doesn't want to hear any more claims about the gravel company has about poverty.
- 160 trucks/hr. at peak times.
- Tired of being told it is for the good and the Province.
- All three pieces of his property have decreased in value.
- Pavement should not be an option, it should be a mute point.
- Grader cannot keep up with the movement of the trucks especially if the Lehigh's Pit goes forward.
- Roads are too narrow.

Ms. Janet Rosenke presented the following comments:

- 51060 Range Road 33
- Uses Jones haul road and Burnco's haul road to travel to and from her home.
- She questions that if these operations were closer to a city such as Leduc that these conditions would not be allowed.
- Believes that the residents are paying the price, and businesses are reaping the benefits
