PG-01 Application of Gravel

Policy Statement

To identify the quality and quantity of gravel to be used, and the locations of roadway to be graveled as part of the annual graveling program ensuring the integrity and safety of the roadway is maintained over the life cycle of the road

Service Level Standards

1. Approximately one third (1/3) of County gravel roads are to be graveled annually. The Director, Public Works and Engineering will determine, by road conditions, which roads will be graveled on an annual basis and present to Public Works Committee for approval.
2. At a minimum, all roads will be included in the gravelling program once every five years.
3. Local gravel roads will be graveled with a 420 modified spec and will receive between 250 – 350 tonnes per mile.
4. Gravelling operations under the gravelling program will normally occur in November, December, January, February, and March of each year. Other gravelling will occur as road conditions dictate.
5. The following areas may receive up to 38 tonnes of gravel every five years:
 - a. Rural Community Halls
 - b. Churches and/or Cemeteries
 - c. Agricultural Societies
 - d. Senior Centers or Facilities
 - e. Leduc #1 Historical Society
 - f. Rundle Mission
 - g. Warburg Seed Cleaning Co-op
 - h. Leduc West Antique Society
6. This Policy is for road maintenance only and does not apply to new construction or accesses.

Authority

The *Director, Public Works & Engineering* is responsible for maintaining & updating this policy and ensuring that the appropriate resources are available to meet the service levels.

Monitoring & Updating

This Policy shall be reviewed every two (2) years.

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
